3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Fence Line Fairness5 Act of 2025".

SEC. 2. NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM OVERSIGHT MEDIATION COMMITTEES.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Agriculture (referred to in this section as the "Secretary"), in consulta-4 5 tion with State departments of agriculture and State departments of natural resources, shall establish in each 6 7 State in which National Forest System land is located an 8 oversight mediation committee (referred to in this section as a "mediation committee") to help resolve disputes be-9 tween private landowners and the Secretary regarding the 10 11 location of boundaries between National Forest System land and private land. 12

13 (b) Composition.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—A mediation committee shall
15 be composed of—

16 (A) 2 individuals who are private, active
17 farmers or ranchers from the State in which the
18 mediation committee is established, to be appointed by the Secretary; and

(B) 3 individuals who are private, active
farmers or ranchers from the State in which the
mediation committee is established, to be appointed by the applicable State department of
agriculture or State department of natural resources.

1	(2) TERMS.—A member of a mediation com-
2	mittee—
3	(A) shall be appointed for a term of 5
4	years; and
5	(B) may serve for not more than 2 terms.
6	(c) NOTIFICATION.—If there is a dispute regarding
7	the location of a boundary between National Forest Sys-
8	tem land and private land, the Secretary shall—
9	(1) notify the private landowner of the dispute
10	not later than 30 days after the date on which the
11	Secretary becomes aware of the dispute; and
12	(2) provide to the private landowner the option
13	to use the mediation committee process described in
14	subsection (d) to help resolve the dispute.
15	(d) DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS.—
16	(1) REFERRAL.—If a private landowner notifies
17	the Secretary that the landowner chooses to use the
18	mediation committee process referred to in sub-
19	section $(c)(2)$, the Secretary shall refer the dispute
20	to the applicable mediation committee not later than
21	60 days after the date on which the private land-
22	owner notifies the Secretary.
23	(2) PROCESS.—With respect to a dispute re-
24	ferred to a mediation committee under paragraph
25	(1), the mediation committee shall—

1	(A) hold private hearings regarding the
2	dispute to analyze information and testimony
3	from the private landowner and appropriate of-
4	ficials of the Forest Service;
5	(B) provide to the parties to the dispute
6	described in subparagraph (A) recommenda-
7	tions for actions that can be taken by the par-
8	ties to resolve the dispute; and
9	(C) submit a report describing findings of
10	fact regarding the dispute and recommenda-
11	tions described in subparagraph (B) to—
12	(i) the Secretary;
13	(ii) the Chief of the Forest Service;
14	(iii) the head of the applicable State
15	department of agriculture;
16	(iv) the head of the applicable State
17	department of natural resources;
18	(v) the Committee on Agriculture,
19	Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate; and
20	(vi) the Committee on Agriculture of
21	the House of Representatives.
22	(3) TIMELINE.—Not later than 180 days after
23	the date on which a dispute is referred to a medi-
24	ation committee under paragraph (1), the mediation
